A smarter way to move water.

The hippo water roller can tranport more water, more easily and in less time than carrying 20-liter buckets on the head. It was designed for use in tough rural conditions and can handle most terrains, including sand and stony roads, sharp rocks and steep hills, since two people can pull the roller if necessary.

- A hippo roller moves 90 liters of water by rolling it on the ground.
- The weight is distributed over a large area so even a child can manage a full roller.
- One trip to the water source using a hipporoller equals five trips with a bucket.
- Made from one piece of UV-safe plastic, it has

no seams or welds making it very durable.

- It requires no spare parts or maintenance and has a life span of 5-7 years.
- This labor and time-saving tool is a step towards more empowering activities, such as growing vegetable gardens

THE NEED

The head of the United Nations food agency warned that, as the world grapples with the COVID-19 pandemic, many countries in Africa are also "on the brink of a hunger pandemic" that could lead to multiple famines if immediate action isn't taken.

IN MANY RURAL SETTLEMENTS in South Africa, women are the frontline workers. As the COVID-19 upsets the familiar community routines, unemployment, business failures, school closures, and social isolation have become the new reality. With little income and sparse government assistance, women are faced with providing food for their families by growing their own food.

Providing women with a **Survival Garden Kit** that includes the tools and seedlings to start small vegetable gardens, is the most immediate and productive action we can take to help them create food security and self-sufficiency during and after the pandemic. **Helping women establish survival gardens has short and long-term benefits**:

- ▶ While the coronavirus is the immediate threat, its impact will be felt for years.
